


# St. Stephen's Story

### OUR UPWARD, INWARD AND OUTWARD RESPONSIBILITIES

"Built together." That's how Paul describes the church in [Ephesians 2:22](#). Throughout the

Bible, we are confronted with the fact that God's people are not called to be isolated individuals,

but to be a people in community, in a fellowship. The people of God are not just isolated saints — they are brothers and sisters, members of God's family, living stones in God's temple, and members together of one body, the body of Christ.

We say that the church has upward, inward, and outward responsibilities. "Upward" denotes our relationship with God. We give glory, worship and praise to God, our Creator. We talk to God in prayer, listen to God's word in regular study and meditation, and continually dedicate ourselves to God's will and service. We each do this on an individual basis, and also when we gather as the body of Christ.

In our minds and in our hearts, we are learning to love God with all that we are. With our words, we praise God and acknowledge our dependence on God. We confess with our lips that Jesus is our Lord. And with our whole bodies, we serve him and do his will in the world. In all that we do, we belong to him, and are learning to yield ourselves entirely to him.

"Inward" denotes our nurturing and faithful relationships with each other in the body of Christ. Because Jesus lives in us, we edify one another, encourage one another, teach one another, learn from one another, serve one another. The Christian life is not an isolated life. It is life in the family of God. Followers of Jesus Christ, by their very nature as the people of God, interact with one another. Our lives reflect the love of Jesus for his brothers and sisters. Small groups are some of the main settings where Christian love and nurture "happens." In small

groups, we get to know one another as real children of God, much more than just passing acquaintances. In confidential settings, we are better able to discuss our mutual spiritual journey — our concerns, joys, struggles, and victories. We are better able to edify and encourage one another because we better know one another's needs and circumstances. We allow ourselves to be accountable to others, and they help us grow spiritually even as we help them. Our journey is with Christ, it is he who takes us on that journey and we go willingly never by coercion.

"Outward" concerns the way we interact with non-Christians in all the places we meet them — on the job, at school, in the marketplace. Having tasted the goodness of God in the gospel, we want nothing more than for our relatives, friends and neighbors to share in the joy and blessings of salvation in Jesus Christ. We pray for God to open their minds and touch their hearts, and we offer ourselves to be used by him in this process. We pray for God to help us discern when they may want to know the reason for the hope within us.

Our words with non-Christians reflect Christ's love in us. They are encouraging, sensitive and thoughtful — not coarse, vulgar, negative or depressing. They are positive, forgiving, helpful. They reflect joy, peace, patience, gentleness and kindness. We express our care and our willingness to pray for those who are in need. Our actions are also those of a transformed heart, in the way we treat our family members, and the way we help our neighbors.

Every area of life involves relationships. Through Jesus Christ, we are being reconciled to one another and to our Father in heaven. Our relationship with God is characterized by humility and repentance when we look at what we are, and joy and adoration when we look at who he is and what he has done for us. As we ask him to fill us with his love, his love moves us to begin to desire his will above all else, and to want to share the joy of his salvation with our friends, too.

In March of 2016, the Vestry participated in a Core Value exercise to identify what is it that St. Stephen's stands for? Why do we do what we do around here? What can we do for you? And items we do not like. Core Values reflect our uniqueness, reflect mission, shape ministry and lay the foundation for Vision.

Our mission is really defined in An Outline of the Faith, Book of Common Prayer on page 855.

Q: What is the mission of the Church?

A: The mission of the church is to restore all people to unity with God and each other in Christ.

Q: How does the Church pursue its mission?

A: The Church pursues its mission as it prays and worships, proclaims the Gospel, and promotes justice, peace, and love.

Q: Through whom does the Church carry out its mission?

A: The Church carries out its mission through the ministry of all its members.

In February 2017, the Vestry met and identified a vision through a visioning event and created their Vision Statement. Now for the fun part. WE will meet as a congregation to participate in a Visioning Event on Saturday, June 3, 8:30 am-12:30 pm. At this Visioning Community Meeting, we will meet in small groups and develop a visioning statement, seeking input from all. All 16 years and older are invited to participate.

- Vestry members will help facilitate our small groups as we seek your input.
- We will then compare the results and develop a single document of like vision areas.

# Altar Guild



When you walk into St. Stephens in anticipation of the celebration of the Eucharist, have you ever thought about how the preparation work is accomplished? You prepare yourself spiritually, but there's a great deal more that goes on to prepare the church for that service.


One of the first things we notice upon entering the sanctuary are the candles. Some of the candles burn fuel that needs refilling periodically – other wax candles need replacing as they burn down. Our altar linen changes color with the liturgical seasons and festivals. The holy water level must be maintained. Brass and silver requires periodic polishing since it's handled by many. The Lay Eucharistic Visitor kits that parishioners take to the home-bound and Larksfield Place must be cleaned and readied for use.

But back to the service. The Eucharist, being the center of the Episcopal worship service, is the focus of the work of the Altar Guild. The instruments and accoutrements of the Eucharist – the bread, wine, chalices, patens, corporal and linens are set up in a prescribed manner, reverently and prayerfully. When the service is over, protocol is maintained for disposing of consecrated hosts and wine. All instruments are then cleaned and put away following the service.

Many of you know I am describing the duties of the Altar Guild, members who come every Saturday and prepare St. Stephens Church for the week ahead. Because St. Stephens has the luxury of four teams, an individual member is only responsible for one Saturday each month. Altar Guild work is a wonderful way to learn about the workings of the church, the liturgical calendar, and kind of a "behind the scene" look at the service.

If you would like to learn more about Altar Guild without a full time commitment, I invite you to talk to an Altar Guild member or visit with Audrey Kramer, Joan Jaedicke, or Gina Hollingshead. Try it for a month or two and see if you would enjoy being a permanent member of a team. And, of course, traditionally Altar Guild work was for "women", but like so many other things, that's a part of the past. Now we think of Altar Guild work as gender neutral – so men. If this sounds like something you might enjoy doing . . .

## EfM Graduation



Four years ago Barbara Fizer, Tom Steele and Chuck Shield began their four year journey through Education for Ministry. On May 21st, they will receive their Graduation Certificates at the all Parish Picnic and Mass on the Grass at the Staples' Ranch.

For those of you who do not know what EfM is: it is a four year course of study that encompasses Old Testament, New Testament, Church History and Theology. Each year stands alone so that if life situations change a student cannot continue course in the full four periods, they may stop and start again.

This is adult education that does require reading and discussion of the various years, but there are no written papers due and the reading is at the student's own pace. Each class group must have at least six members and no more than 12. The class is led by trained mentors—a mentor is a guide not a teacher.

If you are interested in deepening your faith, spirituality and knowledge. All are welcome. Currently the classes are on Monday evenings and run from fall to spring. The course is \$370.00 per year. This fee includes your books for a given year. There are scholarships available (check with the Parish Office). The fee is due at registration.

The St. Stephens Book Club has two more meetings this spring. We will meet at noon on May 4th and May 11th.




